APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the January 11, 2024, meeting of the Council of Basic Education were approved on an **Aichele/Barrett** motion.

REPORT OF THE DEPUTY SECRETARY FOR ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION

Dr. Carrie Rowe, Deputy Secretary for Elementary and Secondary Education, discussed forthcoming changes to Pennsylvania's system of school assessments that will implement online testing for the PSSA and Keystone Exams by 2026, incorporate technology-enhanced items on the assessments, and reduce the amount of time spent on standardized testing. Dr. Rowe discussed the advantages of online testing, including cost savings, the ability to deliver accommodations to students with disabilities more discreetly, a reduction in administrative tasks for test administration, a reduction in testing time for students, and a quicker return of results to schools. Dr. Rowe said paper and pencil tests will continue to be available as needed for students with disabilities or where students may not have access to the internet. She also discussed efforts the Department is undertaking to determine where there are issues with internet connectivity or equipment and how the Department can be responsive to those needs.

Dr. Rowe said the Department also is developing a free, optional predictive benchmark assessment tool for schools that can help educators better understand whether students are on track to succeed on end-of-year exams and identify issues that then can be addressed earlier in the year. Finally, Dr. Rowe said the Department will provide enhanced integrated reporting for schools that will show either a student has met the proficiency requirement or has demonstrated growth during the year.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Dr. Williams shared a status update on the proposed amendments to Chapter 4 that were approved by the Board in January. She shared that the proposed regulation is currently with the Office of Attorney General (OAG) for review. Following approval by OAG, Dr. Williams said the proposed amendments to Chapter 4 will be opened for a 30-day public comment period, transmitted to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission, and transmitted to the House and Senate Education Committees.
